A) Internship

Was your internship in accordance with the experience offered? (Excellent, Good, Fair, Poor)

The internship was very good. At the beginning I received input on outline of the training content. A small project for the two-month period was prepared for me. Together with the Professor and a graduate student I performed the experiments and I was supposed to analyze the data and to write a small report. I received some additional papers to study. I also had some lectures with the professor in which he explained me methods on how to further analyse the data.

I had my own office room, which was very well equipped. Before I arrived, I was asked to bring my own laptop for the work. Unfortunately, there was no internet (or wifi) connection possible in my room.

The outline of the training was very well prepared, so it was good to know what I am supposed to do during the internship. I was asked to write a report on the training content, and I could chose by myself what to write about.

The people at my workplace were really nice and helpful in case I had questions. I only had contact with the professor and some students who helped me with the experiments. I had my own office room so normally I wouldn't have many interactions with other people at the workplace.

Yes, I worked on the topic "Strength at room temperature after heating of high strength concrete using limestone aggregate and polypropylene (PP) fibers". Therefore, we performed high temperature heating experiments on concrete specimen with varying PP fiber volume and tested their strength using compression tests.

So, it was nice and quiet, supermarkets and drug store and train stations were nearby and easy to walk to.
